What are the goals of our proposal?

- **Protect the rights** of European citizens.
- Freedom of expression and creativity \rightarrow Responsibility on shared contents.

Proposal Overview



- Freedom of Panorama: citizens must have the right to decide if they want the copyright on their properties.
- **Filter Clause:** users hold the responsibility of copyright infringement, platforms must apply countermeasures.
- Link Tax: information content aggregators must pay a fixed tax to the Member States in order to use press publications of national publisher.

Chaotic situation now


OK, including buildings, works of art and public interiors


Freedom of Panorama



- Private citizens have the right to pretend the copyright on their private properties.
- Right applicable only on **disclosure** or **commercial** use of visual content.
- Fair Use excluded.
- Member States should provide **adequate mechanisms** to let citizens exert their rights.







Filter Clause

- The video became unavailable due to third party copyright claims.


Filter Clause




- **Single individuals** who share the content are **liable** for copyright infringement.
- Platforms must develop **content filters** not in order to ban but to supervise and aware users that their contents may infringe a copyright.




Newspapers business and Online News Trend in the last 10 years

"Neighbouring rights: a question of life or death"

"[...] So many friends have stopped reporting because their media organization closed or could no longer pay them. Up until the day they put away their pens and cameras, we had shared the terrible fear of hiding behind a wall that trembled as intensely we did from the impact of the explosions; the indescribable joy when we succeeded, when we could tell the world the "truth" that we had seen with our own eyes; [...] The European Parliament should vote in favour of survival of democracy and one of its most remarkable symbols: journalism."





- News aggregators agree with national governments on the amount of the tax to be paid based on their catchment area.
- Each Member State redeploys that money to press publishers based on their amount of customers.
- It is applied only to platforms with commercial purpose, **directly and indirectly**.
